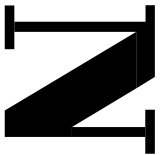

THE JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION

What is it?

The Junior Livestock Auction is the climax of a year's activity for 4-H and FFA. It is a learning and business venture. The young exhibitors select, feed and groom either a market beef, lamb or hog. These exhibitors each spend an average of 300 hours feeding and fitting their stock for the show. These are hours invested in sound education, in learning responsibility and basic principles of our free market system. The product of their year's labor is then brought to the Fair to be judged, graded and sold.

The Fair is their marketplace!

Here they present their stock and receive the monetary value for their product along with public recognition for their efforts.

Will you help?

Your support of the Junior Sale will enable these 4-H and FFA exhibitors to earn funds for college, to buy more animals and give them a background in good business.

ADMISSION FOR THE AUCTION

Buyers who have purchased animals the previous year will receive 2 FREE Fair admissions in the mail to be used for Saturday, the date of the sale. Buyer numbers may be picked up upon check-in at the registration table. This year's buyers will receive 2 FREE admissions for next year's fair.

BUYERS' RECEPTION & PRE-VIEW

A buyer's reception will be held on the livestock lawn at 4:00 P.M. Paid for by **American Ag Credit**—Oakdale, cooked by volunteers and hosted by the Junior Livestock Auction Committee. The livestock exhibitors will meet and greet prospective buyers in the Beef, Sheep, and Hog barns.

WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR PURCHASE

- 1 Have custom cut and wrapped, fill your freezer and enjoy.
- 2 Have the animal automatically resold to a meat packer at market price and pay only the difference.

How the resale works:

If you buy a 100 lb. lamb for \$1.50 per lb.

Sale Price - \$150.00

Approximate market value \$0.68 per lb.

Market Value - \$68.00

Sale price less market value is your

donation.

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

Livestock Exhibitors will be paid for their animals. Cash, check or credit payment is expected at the time of purchase. Please, make payment the evening of the sale. Thanks to

the generosity of **Umpqua Bank**, the official Junior Livestock Auction Bank, there will be no service fee for using your credit card. All amounts due are to be paid to the Mother Lode Fair. Accounts not paid within 30 days are considered delinquent. A finance charge of 1.5% per month, (18% annually) will be charged on all accounts over 30 days.
