

# SHOWMANSHIP

**Rules & Information: This is mandatory.** All livestock exhibitors must enter showmanship with each specie exhibited or exhibitor will be eliminated from market and breeding classes with that specie. Entries must be made by the fair entry deadline on Livestock entry forms. **Except for 4-H primary showmanship**, only animals owned, fitted and shown by the exhibitor at the fair may enter showmanship.

**DEFINITIONS**

**FFA NOVICE** - Open to FFA exhibitors showing this specie for the first year. Previous FFA Novice winners are not eligible. First and second place winners advance to FFA Advanced Showmanship.

- Example: An FFA member who has never shown swine in any organization but has shown Poultry for 3 years in 4-H enters FFA Novice Swine showmanship.

**FFA ADVANCED** - Open to FFA exhibitors showing this specie for the second year and up. First and Second place winners advance to FFA Large or Small Animal Round Robin Showmanship, depending upon specie shown.

- Example: an FFA member who has never shown swine in any organization but has shown Poultry for 3 years in 4-H enters FFA Advanced Poultry showmanship.

**4-H PRIMARY** - Age 5-8 years old. Participation ribbons only. Exhibitor must be enrolled as a Primary Member in the 4-H project to enter. Classes open to Primary Members are Nigerian Dwarf Goat, Pygmy Goat, Poultry, and Rabbit. Primary Members do not bring their own animals to Fair. They must have permission from a Junior Livestock Exhibitor to use that Exhibitor’s animal in Primary Showmanship.

**4-H JUNIOR** - Open to all 4-H members age 9 and 10 as of 12/31/2020. First and second place winners advance to 4-H Intermediate Showmanship.

**4-H INTERMEDIATE** - Open to all 4-H members age 11-13 as of 12/31/2020. First and second place winners advance to 4-H Senior Showmanship.

**4-H SENIOR** - Open to all 4-H members age 14-18 on 12/31/2020. First and second place winners advance to 4-H Large or Small Animal Round Robin Showmanship, depending upon specie shown.

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# GOATS

## RULES & INFORMATION:

1. American System of Judging, except as noted.
2. Showmanship must accompany each goat breed entries (Meat, Pygmy, Fiber, Dairy, and Nigerian Dwarf)
3. Market goats are divided into 4-H and FFA. All other goat classes are 4-H, FFA and Independent combined.
4. Horns permissible in all Goat breeds except Dairy. No open sores or unhealed disbudding sites will be allowed.
5. All goats entering the fair shall be identified by a permanent number (ear tag, tattoo or brand) on the animal which matches the number recorded on the entry form.
6. All goats must be individually owned and cared for by the exhibitor for a minimum of sixty (60) consecutive days prior to the opening day of the Fair.
7. When determining the age of goats for entry, it is based on the opening day of the Fair.
8. No extra animals or animals not entered in the fair will be admitted or allowed to stay on the fairgrounds.
9. Any sick, injured or known infected goat shall not be admitted or allowed to remain on the fairgrounds.
10. Only Does and Wethers are allowed (exception for Meat Goat buck breeder classes – pen security is on the exhibitor).
11. For all Wethers, castration sites shall be healed and free of inflammation.
12. If an exhibitor has more than one animal in a class, only another registered livestock exhibitor(s) can help show the additional animals.
13. Use a separate Livestock Entry Form for each breed classification.
14. Fair Management reserves the right to combine or cancel any classes.

## MEAT GOATS (BREEDING)

**Rules & Information:** All Meat Goats entering the Fair are required to have a USDA approved individual scrapie identification. See State Rules: Sheep and Goat Health. Entries in Breeder classes should be washed, clean, neat, and have hooves trimmed. Full shearing is not recommended.

**MARKET GOATS**

**Rules & Information:** All Market Goats entering the Fair are required to have a USDA approved individual scrapie identification (See State Rules: Sheep and Goat Health). Market goats that do not meet the minimum weight will be placed in the Feeder division. After weighing market goats, they may be divided into weight lots. Goats over 105 lbs. discouraged by the processor. All Market Goats must be individually owned and cared for by exhibitor for a minimum of sixty (60) consecutive days prior to the opening day of the Fair and must be weighed and ear tagged at the Mother Lode Fair pre-weigh.

All goats must be clipped or shorn for show, one week or less before the show. Hair is permissible on hocks and below and on tails. Recommended all market goats be disbudded or blunted with maximum horn length of 2 inches prior to arrival on the fairgrounds. Only Wethers and Does judged Market Ready are eligible for auction. Animals must be under one (1) year of age and have their milk teeth.

**LOCAL BRED MARKET GOATS**

**Rules & Information:** Must be produced in Tuolumne County; determined by residence of breeder. Must be pre-entered with name of breeder to be eligible. No entry fee. No cash awards.

Nigerian Dwarf Does in milk must follow milk-out guidelines and disposal of milk as written for Dairy Goats.

**Rules & Information:** Dairy Goat rules and breed standards will apply. Dairy Goat breeds will be shown together; these include: Alpine, LaMancha, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen, Toggenburg, and Sable. Dairy Goat Does should be groomed and fully clipped to within one-half inch or less, including full body, legs, and udder; blend hair to head. Tail trimmed to look like a blunt paintbrush.

Miniature Dairy Goats are the product of one of the above recognized Dairy breeds bred to a Nigerian Dwarf. Breed standards will apply to all goats entered and can be found at MDGA ([miniaturedairygoats.net](http://miniaturedairygoats.net)).

All Dairy Goats are to be milked twice daily and shall be “milked out” the evening before the show. Over-uddering of dairy goats is discouraged. Based on show time a relief milk-out (only excess to relieve pressure) may be called. Exhibitors must remove milk from fairgrounds, no dumping on grounds or in drains allowed.

1. American System of Judging. Rules, definitions and judging procedure as prescribed in the latest edition of the Official Show Rules and Standards of Perfection of the American Poultry Association, Inc. shall apply to this show, except where they are in conflict with State Rules.
2. All poultry will be inspected prior to coop-in. Upon arrival, as required by the California Department of Food and Agriculture, any bird showing evidence of parasite infestation, disease or illness will not be allowed to enter the Fairgrounds. All birds must be clean and represent the highest quality and standards of that breed.
3. For all classes of Poultry, all birds upon arrival at the Fair must be identified by leg bands conforming to the entry form. Market Poultry will be wing banded at check-in.
4. The exhibitor must state Breed and Variety of each entry on Entry Form.
5. Birds will be shown and judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age and sex only. If no class is offered, no awards may be given. Disqualified birds and those absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of exhibitors in the class. A judge or superintendent may excuse a bird from competition and/or have it removed from the grounds if it appears to be fatigued, infected, or out of condition, but the bird shall be counted as an entry.
6. Standard-bred birds are to be judged primarily for show and meeting the criteria of the Standard of Perfection for their breed and variety.
7. Poultry entries are limited to twelve (12) birds per Exhibitor. Each Market Chicken meat pen counts as a single entry.
8. All poultry must be owned and cared for by the Exhibitor a minimum of thirty (30) consecutive days prior to the opening day of the Fair.
9. Exhibitors will declare at Check-in if they are entering Showmanship with a Turkey (market or heritage) or Any Other Poultry (chicken, game bird waterfowl). The poultry portion of Round Robin is only chickens.

## HERITAGE TURKEYS

**Rules & Information:** Heritage Turkeys are defined by the historic, range-based production system in which they are raised. Turkeys must meet all of the following criteria to qualify as a Heritage turkey:

- **Naturally mating:** The Heritage Turkey must be reproduced and genetically maintained through natural mating, with expected fertility rates of 70% to 80%. Heritage Turkeys must be the result of naturally mating pairs of both grandparent and parent stock.
- **Long productive outdoor lifespan:** The Heritage Turkey must have a long productive lifespan. Breeding hens are commonly productive for 5-7 years and breeding toms for 3-5 years. The Heritage Turkey must have a genetic ability to withstand the environmental rigors of outdoor production systems.
- **Slow growth rate:** The Heritage Turkey must have a slow to moderate rate of growth, reaching a marketable weight in about 28 weeks which gives the birds time to develop a strong skeletal structure and healthy organs prior to building muscle mass. This growth rate is identical to the commercial varieties of the first half of the 20th century.
- Open to Heritage turkey varieties recognized in the American Poultry Association (APA) Standard of Perfection: Black, Bronze, Narragansett, White Holland, Slate, Bourbon Red, Beltsville Small White, and Royal Palm.

Substitutions must be made in writing at Fair Check-in. Substitutions are limited to entries in classes of the same sex, breed, variety and age.

6. Exhibitor is responsible for seeing that their animals get to the judging table. Another exhibitor may assist in getting rabbits to the table. Adults are prohibited from placing rabbits on the show table.
- Rabbit entries are limited to twelve (12) rabbits per Exhibitor. Each Market Rabbit meat pen counts as a single entry.
  - All rabbits must be owned and cared for by the Exhibitor a minimum of thirty (30) consecutive days prior to the opening day of the Fair.
