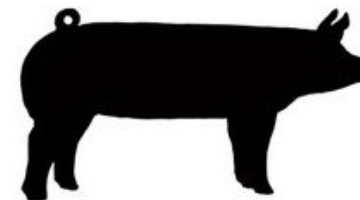
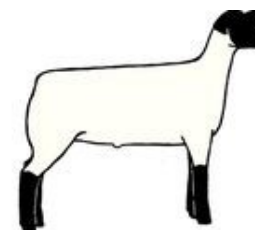
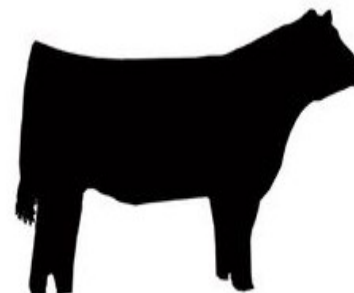

THE JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION

What is it?

The Junior Livestock Auction is the climax of a year's activity for 4-H and FFA. It is a learning and business venture. The young exhibitors select, feed and groom their market projects of beef, sheep, swine, meat goats, rabbits, turkeys and chickens. These exhibitors each spend an average of 300 hours feeding and fitting their stock for the show. These are hours invested in sound education, in learning responsibility and basic principles of our free market system. All fair exhibitors are required to complete the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals ethics program. The product of their year's labor is then brought to the Fair to be judged, graded and sold.

The Fair is their marketplace!

Here they present their stock and receive the monetary value for their product along with public recognition for their efforts.

Will you help?

Your support of the Junior Sale will enable these 4-H and FFA exhibitors to earn funds for college, to buy more animals and give them a background in good business practices.

Bid and Buy

Select your animal yourself, OR have the Sale Committee help you bid.

Buy alone or get together with friends or other businesses and split it! This is your opportunity to invest in the youth of today who are the leaders of tomorrow.

ADMISSION FOR THE AUCTION

Buyers who purchased animals in 2022 will receive 2 FREE Fair admissions for 2023. Bidder numbers may be picked up upon check-in at the registration table, but buyers are encouraged to PRE-REGISTER ONLINE for the live auction to expedite check-in. This year's buyers will receive 2 FREE admissions for next year's fair.

BUYERS' RECEPTION & PREVIEW

A buyers' reception will be held on the Livestock lawn at 3:00 PM, paid for by **American Ag Credit** and **Leslie Heavy Haul**, provided by Rawhide Meats and hosted by the Junior Livestock Auction Committee. The livestock exhibitors will meet and greet prospective buyers in the Livestock barns.

WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR PURCHASE

- 1 Have it custom cut and wrapped, fill your freezer and enjoy.
- 2 Beef, Sheep, Swine and Meat Goats can be automatically resold to a meat packer at market price and you pay only the difference.

How the resale works:

If you buy a 100 lb. lamb for \$3.50 per lb.

Sale Price - \$350.00

Approximate market value \$0.68 per lb.

Market Value - \$68.00

Sale price less market value is what you pay.

This is what you are billed for on resale. The same method is used to calculate beef and swine sales.

- *Current market prices will be posted at the auction.*

WHAT SELLS AT AUCTION?

Market beef, sheep, swine, meat goats, meat rabbits, poultry and meat birds are available in the Junior Livestock Auction. This is a terminal sale – no live pick-up!

AUCTION PAYMENTS

Livestock Exhibitors will not receive their check until their buyer's payment has cleared through the bank. Cash, check or credit payment is expected at the time of purchase. All amounts due are to be paid to the Mother Lode Fair. Accounts not paid within 30 days are considered delinquent. *A finance charge of 1.5% per month, (18% annually) will be charged on all accounts over 30 days.*

Please, make payment the evening of the sale.

There will be a convenience fee of 3.5% of total charged on all credit transactions.
